Choreographers' Bios (in order of performance)

Clarissa Rivera Dyas is a Bay Area, Ohlone land based dancer, choreographer, curator, and arts producer. She centers her artistic practice through the truthfulness of improvisation, investigating the intersection of their black+asian lineage and queerness, with the belief that movement is a spiritual practice as a conduit of change. Clarissa graduated from SFSU in 2017 with a B.A in Dance and a B.S. in Health Education. They have been a company member of Zaccho Dance Theatre, Robert Moses' Kin, and Flyaway Productions and have performed with Lenora Lee Dance, Megan Lowe Dances, OYSTERKNIFE, GRAVITY and many others. Clarissa is a co-conspirator of RUPTURE and collaborates with Sara Shelton Mann and Embodiment Project. They have presented in the Dresher Ensemble Artist Residency, Queering Dance Festival's FROLIC! and ROT/KH FRESH Festival. She was awarded Dance Magazine's, "25 to Watch" January 2024 for her choreographic work. Clarissa is on the Queering Dance Festival Steering Committee and is Co-Director of ROT/KH FRESH Festival.

dominique lesleyann is a powerhouse. A divine vibrant being. She is a storyteller; revisiting and reimagining all aspects of herself, and allowing her experiences to shape her reality. Diving intorealms of love and collaboration, she is exploring empathetic and compassionate ways of listening and learning from herancestors, family, and friends on how to cultivate and sustain a thriving community. As a teacher, she invites her students in the process of self reflection. Co-creating a space where her students feel called to swim in the pools of their inner truth and create/perform movement from the space of authenticity. dominique has had the pleasure of training with Deeply rooted dance theater, Hubbard street, Homer hans Bryant, LINES Ballet BFA program, Guy Shoromi and Sidra Bell. She has had the opportunity of choreographing and performing internationally in Portugal and Vancouever and domestically throughout the Bay Area. dominique is currently an arts education teaching artist in the SF and Oakland area and dancing with Dance Brigade. She is excited to be returning to her origins as a dancer and choreographer; diving into the ritual form that is movement medicine. asé. amen. and so it is.

Aja Randall + Patricia West of DAP: DAP was created in 2017 out of necessity as the collaborators found themselves grappling with what it means to be a dancer/dancemaker while also taking on roles as provider and caretaker. The group uses movement as a language of solidarity, resistance and self-expression while also considering the dynamics of listening, being heard and yielding. Spoken word, organic movement and song are tools they lean on in their dancemaking.

Patricia West (she/her) was born and raised in the Bay Area. As an educator and choreographer, she aims to create and support spaces that foster self-expression, collaboration and connection to oneself. She has had the honor of performing nationally and internationally with various dance companies. Patricia has been a Collaborating Artist of Joe Goode Performance Group (JGPG) since 2006. She has served as JGPG's Assistant Director and Creative Engagement Lead. Currently, Patricia works for Cal Performances' Education and Community Programs and is the director of their transformational program, Berkeley/Oakland AileyCamp. Patricia is grateful for every rising opportunity to teach, create and perform.

Aja Randall (she/her) is from St. Louis, Mo and graduated from Stephen College in Columbia, Mo with a BFA in Dance and Minor in Education. Aja moved to the Bay Area in 2004, and has danced for several local artists with the longest stretch for Afro-Cuban based Alayo Dance Company. Yoga Alliance Certified since 2017, she strongly believes in its philosophy and practice to help in maintaining longevity in art making and the care taking of the aging body. Being the Venue & Ops Manager with Joe Goode Performance Group is a manifestation come true. Witnessing, supporting, and uplifting our artistic community is just lovely, just right.

natalya janay shoaf, based in the Bay Area, is a renowned dance educator, choreographer, and performer with a dynamic career spanning both education and performance. She is currently dance educator at Oakland School for the Arts, a company member with the foundry — directed by Alex Ketley, and in residency at The Athenian School, Cal Sate University East Bay, and ODC. He received a BFA in Modern Dance Performance and Choreography from the University of South Florida and continued his dance education at the Alonzo King LINES Ballet Training Program. Recently, Dazaun graduated from California College of the Arts with a Masters in Architecture (MArch). Dazaun is an adjunct professor at the University of San Francisco, a Gyrotonic Instructor, Reiki Master and Apprentice Herbalists. His mediums include dance, architecture, sculpture and interactive installations.

Giordan Cruz began his dance training in 2008 at in Miami, FL. After graduating, he continued his studies at the Alonzo King LINES Ballet Training Program under the direction of Karah Abiog. Where he had the opportunity to work with renowned artists such as David Harvey, Shannon Gillen, and Gregory Dawson. Following his time at lines Giordan joined visceral dance Chicago from 2016-2018. Now based in Berlin, he continues to expand his artistic voice. His movement has also been featured in campaigns for global brands like Nike, ASICS, and Axel Arigato.

Jordon Ellis Dabney is a musician, writer, and mover born and raised in Oakland, CA. They grew up in arts families like ODC, Shawl Anderson, Dimensions Dance Theater and Oaktown Jazz making collaborative art in learning spaces and on the stage. Co-creating music and movement has become their favorite way to share their thoughts and feelings with others, something that shines through their work in the Black Choreographer's Festival with dazaun.dance, Axis Dance Company, and the Black Excellence Band.

Claire Fisher-Mendez was born and raised in Tracy, California. She moved to San Francisco to train in the LINES Ballet Training Program and San Francisco Conservatory of Dance. From then on she has freelanced around the Bay Area working with choreographers, companies and colleagues including Bellwether Dance Project, dazaun.dance, Fullstop Dance, Garrett + Moulton Productions, Liv Schaffer, RAWdance, and Margaret Jenkins Dance Company.

William Brewton Fowler Jr. (Sat) s a Christian freelance dancer and emerging choreographer from Augusta, Georgia. In New York, he worked with Gallim Dance and Stephanie Batten Bland's Company, SBB. In the Bay Area, he was a member of the OBC and worked with Tinypistol, dawsondancesf, and SFBATCO. He also began aerial work with Joanna Haigood and worked with Mia Chong for the first season of Eight/Moves.

Sriba Kwadjovie Quintana (Sun) was born and raised in the SF Bay Area and at the age of five began her African Diasporic dance training at her mother's dance school, Beatriz Ross Cultural Dance Ensemble, along with classical ballet training at the Oakland Ballet and then with Ballet Petit. As an undergraduate at UC Irvine, Sriba had the opportunity to study modern dance under the legendary dancer/choreographer, Donald McKayle. She has performed with Bay Area dance companies such as, Company Chaddick, ODC, Robert Moses' Kin, Epiphany Dance Theater and is currently a member of Susana Pedroso's, Arenas Dance Company. In 2015 she was selected to perform a solo project for the Havana Biennial opening of the "Mirage" exhibition in Cuba and most recently was commissioned by the Southern Exposure art gallery to create a piece for the "Once Removed" exhibition in 2021. Sriba's dance film, "The Sower" was a selected short for screening at the San Francisco Dance Film Festival in 2023.

tara george (Sat) is a Bay Area-based choreographer, writer, and dancer originally from Jupiter Florida. After graduating with her BFA in Dance from UF in 2020 she completed the two-year Alonzo King Lines Ballet Training Program and then went on to be named as one of ODC's Pilot Artists in its 73rd iteration of the program. Recently she performed in Grace Catherdal with Oysterknife and Brava Theater with SFBATCO. She is currently part of Dancing Earth's Bay Area Company Cohort and was seen on their Mexican tour.

Tamara Williams (Sun) is a native of Augusta, GA. She earned her BFA in Dance from Florida State University and her MFA in Dance from Hollins University in collaboration with ADF, The Forsythe Company, and Frankfurt University (Germany). She founded Moving Spirits, Inc in 2011, to uplift Black narratives and educate the general public in African diaspora dance forms.

Justin Sharlman began his dance journey at California State University East Bay, immersing himself in theatre and dance productions that explored contemporary, modern, and hip hop styles. He earned his B.A. in Dance in August 2024, deepening his expertise in both performance and choreography. Since 2011, Justin has been a committed company member of Dimensions Dance Theater, showcasing his dynamic artistry in every production. Currently, he serves as the lead choreographer for Covenant Church's Worship in Arts Ministry, where his creative vision brings compelling movement to life. Passionate about evolving his artistic voice, Justin is committed to exploring new creative horizons and sharing his unique vision with the world.

Gabriele Christian (b. 1991) is a San Francisco-based conceptual artist and descendent of stolen folk. Experimenting within somatic practices, language, performance composition, video production and community arts facilitation, they locate and center BlaQ (Black and Queer) experience, vernacular, and aesthetics as wellsprings for radical futurity. They perform original work and collaborate trans- and inter-nationally, most recently Berlin, New York City, Vienna, and Amsterdam. They are a founding member of multiple Bay Area born performance collectives and land projects including: RUPTURE; OYSTERKNIFE; and BlaQyard. They currently serve as Executive Director and Co-Artistic Director of Jess Curtis/Gravity, a body-based arts and accessibility non-profit living on in the wake of Jess Curtis' transition in March 2024. At the heart of all their work: exhaustive research into belonging, spirit, and desirability while living in the fangs of dehumanizing times.
